MESSAGE FROM OUR PRESIDENT AND CEO, JANET CAMPBELL

Dear Friends and Supporters,

I want to share with you a portion of a letter that I received. The story of this survivor is a powerful testament to resilience, courage, and hope that inspires me every day.

A young woman, someone's daughter and friend, from a small Canadian town she was drawn into the world of human trafficking. Lured by someone she thought she could trust, she was manipulated, exploited, and stripped of her freedom. "I was groomed, manipulated, drugged, exploited and gone for my life for weeks. It happened so fast and casually..."

She shared just how widespread and deeply rooted trafficking networks really are: "Human trafficking is not just one or two people; it is much more organized and advanced than that." For her, the nightmare didn't end with escape. She described the feeling of isolation and frustration, often left to fend for herself, facing disbelief and inadequate support.

Her healing journey is only just beginning, and the road ahead is fraught with unimaginable obstacles. When she finally connected with the Joy Smith Foundation, she felt, for the first time, understood and supported. "The Joy Smith Foundation was the only support that I felt could validate and offer authentic, educated support," she shared. Her words are a testament to the importance of specialized care that sees and supports survivors as they rebuild their lives.

At the Foundation, we know that healing is rarely straightforward. Every survivor's path is unique, and that's why our Empowerment program walks alongside each survivor's healing journey providing customized support. But we know there is more to be done.

I am pleased to share a new chapter in our commitment to survivors: **the development** of a specialized trauma program created in collaboration with Tim Fletcher Co.

This program will provide comprehensive psychological and emotional support tailored specifically to the needs of human trafficking survivors. It's a significant investment—\$68,000 over two years for each survivor—but one that is crucial for true healing.

As I reflect on the Foundation's purpose, I am reminded of why we began—to bring hope, healing, and a new beginning to those who have suffered unimaginable injustices. The road is challenging, but with your support, we can make a profound difference in the lives of many more survivors. Together, we are not just building a bridge to recovery; we are creating a future where every survivor can live in freedom and safety.



The podcast's inspiration came from a personal encounter with a young girl caught in an online world that glamorized unrealistic lifestyles, nearly leading her down a dangerous path. Moved by her story, Kate and Nicole felt compelled to counteract these influences with an authentic, real voice. Over the past year, Luma and Bloom has explored topics intersecting with human trafficking and shared stories that reflect the complex realities many face today.

"We all have a story," Kate reflects.

"Each of us has a journey worth telling, and it's been incredible to see the healing that comes from connecting." Nicole adds,

"I don't think I've ever walked away from recording without feeling impacted.

The guests always leave me touched by their openness." This authenticity resonates deeply with listeners, who often reach out to share how the episodes help them confront their own experiences


The See The Trafficking Signs initiative had over 100 news stories on February 22, 2024—the official Human Trafficking Awareness Day for Canada. That was incredible!


